

What has been so lovely though is that often these were unexpected and gained by relatively young athletes. So young in fact that one young athlete was returning home to get her GCSE results!

Of course there is a lot of training involved and once they return they have to start all over again to focus on the next event. There is something in this that reflects all of our daily lives. We are constantly picking up the reins and starting again. Perhaps this is most obvious in the world of education - school term starts this month, A Level and GCSE results are out leading to new beginnings – university, apprenticeships, new jobs and so on.




