

News from John Witty: Orkney is made of 70 islands skerries - small uninhabited islets of these islands only 16 are inhabited, lying on latitude 59 degrees north which is only 50 miles south of Greenland. Orkney at its widest is 30 miles from east to west and 53 miles north to south with a total coastline of 570 miles, the islands cover 974 square kilometres (376 square miles) That the isles have a long and colourful history, would be no exaggeration. People have lived and worked in Orkney from stone age (orcadians)who left a legacy of monuments that continue today through to the Vikings who took the islands in the eighth or ninth century and made them powerful of the earldom of the kingdom Norway and beyond, house and tombs dating back over 5,000 years and some lines of Orkney stone age temples is 800 years older then Stonehenge, and although the stone circles around the ness of brodgar is remains of Orkney past example is surrounded by a complex of bronze age burials mounds and cains and prehistoric earthworks very interesting, place to go to very friendly island. We had a royal quiz with prizes provided by Mrs Humphrey and members swapped memories of meeting the Queen and of the coronation in 1953.


