

From the Vicar February 2016

Welcome to February, a month that brings us Candlemas, Ash Wednesday and therefore the season of Lent, followed by Valentine's Day. Since this is a leap year we have an extra day and women can propose to men! We also have a very exciting visit from the Archbishop of York!

A recent report published in January revealed that the number of people attending Church of England services each week has for the first time dropped below 1 million – accounting for less than 2% of the population – with Sunday attendances falling to 760,000. The statistics seem to reflect the C of E's steady decline over recent decades in the face of growing secularism and religious diversity, and the ageing profile of its worshippers. Numbers attending church services have fallen by 12% in the past decade, to less than half the levels of the 1960s. Speaking at the opening of the Anglican primates' meeting in Canterbury, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, said: "In some parts of the Communion decline in numbers has been a pattern for many years. In England our numbers have been falling at about 1% every year since world war two ... The culture [is] becoming anti-Christian, whether it is on matters of sexual morality, or the care for people at the beginning or the end of life. It is easy to paint a very gloomy picture."

The Archbishop is right in that it is very easy to paint a gloomy picture – but statistics vary enormously across the country and here in this Benefice we have actually seen a rise in attendance during 2015. There has been an increase in our usual Sunday attendance from an average of 18 to an average of 21 adults. The Wednesday communion averages 14 adults. We have had 19 Baptisms, 5 Weddings and sadly 12 Funerals. But there is no room for complacency – our Sunday figures simply reveal that in general more people are worshipping more regularly wherever the service is!

However, we still have a long way to go if we are to really grow our churches! It is therefore a delight that Archbishop Sentamu has taken time out of his regular duties (with the permission of the Queen) to get out and about in his Diocese. There is more about his visit to us in this newsletter, but suffice to say that if we are serious about our faith then we, like the Archbishop, have to get out and about and talk to people – this is not something that can be left to the Vicar!

I hope and pray that this year we may bring more people to know the love that God has for each one of us, and that we are seen to be welcoming as well as worshipping communities.
