

"Which star was it again?"

Happy New Year!

Robert Louis Stephenson said 'new beginnings are always delightful; the threshold is the place to pause'. Whether or not we agree with his sentiment, new beginnings often involve change, welcome or not. There is something in all of us that wants to hold on to what we already have to the comfortable and familiar.

But Stephenson is right - the threshold is the place to pause, to stop a while. In a sense the church did this back at the beginning of December. Our pausing for Advent - the preparation for the coming of God in human flesh - was for us the beginning of a new year.

In biblical terms the idea of a threshold is a place of promise - thresholds mark off something holy, a place where God is. There is a huge temptation to think that God is only within the walls of our churches, only with us when we gather for worship, whether once a year or each week. This could not be further from the truth. In many of our Christmas carols we use the word 'Emmanuel' God with us. This is not just for Christmas - God is with us always whether we choose to acknowledge it or not.

January 6th is the feast of the Epiphany (we celebrate this on the Sunday nearest – 5th) and we shall hear again the story of the Wise Men travelling to kneel before the infant king. I wonder what would happen if we were to put ourselves at that threshold, to kneel before Jesus and offer him our gifts and indeed ourselves.

I pray that 2014 will allow us all the opportunity to pause and discover 'God with us' and allow him to work in and through uş for the building up of his kingdom in this place.

For more than 20 years Mercy Ships has brought hope and healing to various parts of West Africa while partnering with local governments to increase the local healthcare systems. The staff on ship are self funding and are all volunteers dealing with thousands of patients, most of whom have no other access to healthcare and who often travel miles on foot when news of the ships arrival spreads. Hundreds of operations are carried out on cleft lips, cataracts, burns and many other treatable conditions, giving new life to the patients.

Members and guests enjoyed a day out on October 10th, travelling by coach to Saltaire, West Yorkshire.
