#### Meeting Wednesday September 1st

After a short amount of business Mrs Humphrey introduced two of her friends from art class, Georgina and Jill, who treated members to a display of a variety of crafts. Jill was aiming to be a W.I. craft judge and had spent two years perfecting various crafts together with detailed portfolios explaining each one. We marvelled at a bag knitted from old DVD tapes, a beautiful felted purse and other examples of knitting, embroidery and decorated eggs to name but a few. At our last meeting on Wednesday October 6th business included arrangements for December when we are to visit Brigg Garden Centre on the 1st (guests would be most welcome to join us, cost £10, please contact Anne Wood 01964 527947) and The Falcon for our Christmas meal on the 17th.

Mrs Wood then introduced Jean Hardy who gave members a tour of canyons in America and Canada including The Grand Canyon, Zion Canyon and Mesa Verde. Jean is a very talented photographer, her talk was accompanied by slides showing amazing rock formations and beautiful scenery. We were particularly fascinated by several slides showing the remains of a village, discovered in Mesa Verde in 1884. Stone houses were built into the side of the canyon under a huge rock overhang. Jean told us that these have been attributed to a tribe of Indians who lived there between 1190 and 1270 and then completely disappeared. Excavations are still taking place but although rubbish tips have been unearthed no skeletons have ever been found.

Our next meeting is Wednesday November 3rd when our guest speaker will be Miss Elle's florist of Beverley. As always, quests would be most welcome (7.30 start, cost £2).

#### TORCH

Saint Nicholas Church is taking the initiative in partnership with Torch to set up an outreach service for people with poor sight in Hornsea and surrounding area. Local groups of this type provide blind and partially sighted people with significant social contact and interesting activityies, in addition to encouraging individuals in their Christian life. Since its foundation in 1959 Torch has grown into an international organisation with a purpose built centre producing literature and bibles in Braille, giant print and on audio disc in English and other languages.

There are already more than 100 local Torch groups around the country where blind and fully sighted people work together in mutual support. The majority of visually impaired people are over retirement age and often can become isolated and abandon going to church due to difficulties in reading, transport and accessing information. The Saint Nicholas Torch Group will meet at the Parish hall probably once a month in an afternoon during the week. Val and David Radford have already been in touch with a number of visually impaired people in the area and hope to encourage their interest by inviting them, along with local church members, to a Torch regional Christmas celebration at Hornsea methodist Church on Saturday, 11th December, at 2pm, when the Torch Choir from hQ in Leicestershire will be singing some of their own songs in addition to leading traditional carols. Torch members from Bridlington, Hull and Scarborough will help raise the roof!

Torch is an interdenominational organisation and David and Val, Regional Co-ordinators, are available on 01964 535914 and would be delighted to hear from anyone willing to help in this work. We would encourage all local churches to identify the needs of any visually impaired members, all of whom would be welcome on December 11th.
