

Holderness Food Bank is based at Hornsea. The idea of the Food Bank is to provide food for families on the "bread Line" in this area. The families are identified by Professionals such as Health Visitors, Social Workers, Doctors, Teachers. The family is then given a voucher to go to the food bank and exchange it for food. On occasions Professionals contact the food bank direct and notify them of a family in need. Details of the work of the Food Bank are displayed on the notice board in St Bartholomew's Church Aldbrough. The point is this is an ongoing operation that requires a constant supply of food.

It has been seen daily, i was lucky one sat, very cold and windy day, lovely little bird to see and fabulous colour markings. The fulmars should be back very soon flying about and resting on the cliffs, and by Jan we should have a few older gannets which will not go out the north sea, just stay miles out at sea. Also we have seen a pair of red throated loons (or divers) and this cold weather there lots of tree sparrows on the feeding stations. How to tell them apart from house sparrows - the heads have a a real dark brown to them. Lastly i hope the our government will take notice of marine conservation society and the RSPB better protections of the seas campaign, better for fishermen and all who lives above the sea and under, and a peaceful
