



David Clark, a Lay Reader, and volunteer representative for OPEN DOORS in our area, will be speaking at the service at Mappleton Church on Sunday 15 November 10.30am. He has sent us this introduction: I look forward to the opportunity to meet with you, and share with you about our work. OPEN DOORS exists solely to give support to Christians worldwide who are suffering or persecuted because they are Christians. Brother Andrew (God's Smuggler) founded this ministry over 50 years ago and the work of supporting those who suffer for their faith is still increasing. I hope to deepen the understanding of Christians of the needs of the Suffering Church, and to encourage people to become aware of what is happening to so many millions of our fellow believers in different parts of our world - from China to Mexico. 
