Withernwick Ladies Group

On 22nd July members and friends enjoyed a coach trip to Ripley.

We arrived in time for coffee before our organised guided tour of the castle which has a "lived in" feeling and can be hired for functions, weddings etc. The rooms on show were impressive with the exception of the room where the wedding ceremony takes place, which seemed a very gloomy affair and the guide was both knowledgeable and amusing about the history of the castle and its owners over the years. Lunch (quality at reasonable prices) was followed by a wander around the church and village, a visit to the various shops and we arrived back in Withernwick at 6pm. A very good day marred only by the <u>freezing</u> weather.

At our August meeting on the 4th, members were entertained by Paul Boyle, a maths teacher who lives in Withernwick but who has been working in an English speaking school in Kuwait for the last few months and who will return there in September. Paul talked about the people of Kuwait and their way of life in the hottest inhabited place on earth. He showed some slides of the country pointing out that most of it is uninhabited desert and oilfields with the 3 million people who live there clustered in the relatively small area of Kuwait City. The city appears to have many impressive buildings virtually all erected in the 20 years since the Gulf War. All roads are dual carriageways, as apparently with petrol at 15 pence per litre everyone drives everywhere and there are no pavements and virtually no landscaping. Kuwait has historically always been a relatively wealthy country, based on ship building and trading but its more recent wealth is based upon the fact that the country floats on a sea of oil.

Paul told us about the levels of society in Kuwait which appears to be dictated by Wasta (power & influence) with all Kuwaiti citizens living top Wasta in various degrees, down to the people (usually Pilipino & Sri Lankan immigrants) who carry out the menial tasks i.e. the many maids, chauffeurs, gardeners, taxi drivers etc having very little and the Bedouins who have no Wasta at all.

Kuwait is clearly no a place to go to for a holiday but fascinating to hear about and after many questions and the usual raffle the meeting ended at 9.45pm.


Paul organises the village website, even when in Kuwait, and is to give us a slide show of old photographs of the village and people on August 17th.

Archbishop of York appoints Evangelist The Revd Canon Roger Simpson, Associate Minister of St Michael le Belfrey, York, has been appointed Archbishop's Evangelist.

As Archbishop's Evangelist, Roger will work with lay people to lead missions throughout the north of England, bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to people in parishes, pubs and clubs, streets and schools.

The Revd Canon Roger Simpson says, "I'm really excited about the potential of this role as Archbishop's Evangelist, and I have a real sense that God is opening doors in the north. Since people have heard about the appointment, they've been getting in touch with me, and I'malready booked to run missions at universities, a cathedral, towns and villages. We'll be taking the Gospel to people, engaging with them andsharing the good news.

"This is the sort of work that I've been doing all throughout My ministry, but since becoming Vicar of St Michael le Belfrey ten years ago, I've devoted my time to one particular church. Now, I can help develop evangelism and Mission across the north of England, as well as at St Michael le Belfrey".

The Archbishop of York, Dr John Sentamu, welcomed Roger's appointment, saying, "I'm delighted to be able to appoint Roger as my Evangelist throughout the north of England. He is passionate about sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and I know he will help many congregations share the good news and engage with their communities".
